That's why AXA Safe Spaces was created


AXA Safe Spaces is a training to help organizations to create safe and supportive workplaces for employees impacted by domestic and sexual violence.

Developed by AXA with the support of leading charities and experts, along with our partner the NO MORE Foundation, this training uses the NO MORE Global Directory*, connecting participants to helplines and support services in over 200 countries around the world.

AXA Safe Spaces follows the 3R methodology* to help workplaces to:



Recognize the signs



Respond with empathy



Refer victim-survivors to specialist support

These are the stories we are telling

Maria's story is the starting point for this training and can be completed in 30 minutes. The additional stories of Anna, Maggie, and Paul can each be completed in 15 minutes. This modular training format offers flexibility and enables participants to start where they feel most at ease progressing at their own pace.



Coercive Control & Disclosure Maria's Story

Fearing her abusive husband's early return, Maria strives to make herself and their home perfect to avoid serious consequences. Upon receiving an email from Maria about her struggles, Sara recognizes the need to create a supportive safe space at work.



Economic Abuse Anna's Story

In an economically abusive relationship, where her partner takes her salary, controls their bank account and her spending, Anna takes a first step to regain control.



Sexual Violence Maggie's Story

After a sexual assault that deeply impacts Maggie's life and trust in others, an act of kindness by a colleague provides a new opportunity to ask for support.



Coercive Control & Physical Violence Paul's Story

In a violent and controlling relationship, Paul finds support from an unexpected source – his colleague, who takes the time to ask if he is okay, listens and believes him.



Victim-survivors Sarah & Andrew's Story

Sarah and Andrew share their journey, some of the ways that employers can support employees, and offer a message of hope.
